SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2023 Emergency Operations Center and Pre-

Disaster Mitigation Grant Programs

I. Purpose

This Information Bulletin (IB) outlines the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Grant Programs Directorate's (GPD) and Federal Insurance and Mitigation Administration's (FIMA) plans for developing and releasing Notices of Funding Opportunity (NOFOs) for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Grant Programs.

II. Applicability

This IB is applicable to State Administrative Agencies (SAAs), tribal governments, and other stakeholders associated with the EOC and PDM related projects identified for federal funding support in accordance with the Joint Explanatory Statement accompanying the *Consolidated Appropriations Act*, 2023 (Pub. L. No. 117-328). Those EOC projects are listed in **Appendix A** and PDM projects are listed in **Appendix B**.

III. Guidance

FEMA is developing the required Notices of Funding Opportunity (NOFOs) that will provide detailed guidance on the FY 2023 EOC and PDM Grant Programs, including funding allocations, application procedures and requirements, allowable costs, cost-share requirements, and other important details about the programs. FEMA anticipates that the NOFOs will be released by early March 2023. In the meantime, representatives of the identified EOC and PDM Community Projects are encouraged to begin developing their project plans, including budget details, that will need to be submitted with their application. The application deadline will likely be 45 days following release of the FY 2023 EOC Grant Program and PDM Grant Program NOFOs, or mid-April 2023.

The only eligible applicants will be State Administrative Agencies (SAAs) and Tribal governments (associated specifically with the PDM projects on tribal lands). SAAs will apply on behalf of the state and local governments associated with the identified EOC and PDM projects. Therefore, representatives of the associated state or local government will need to submit the required application details to their SAA prior to the application deadline (each SAA may establish their own separate deadline for this sub-application process).

All identified EOC and PDM projects will be subject to an Environmental Planning and Historic Preservation (EHP) review conducted by FEMA in accordance with federal EHP laws. No construction activities (including site preparation, utility installations, and any groundbreaking activities) or equipment installations on existing structures may begin until the EHP review process is complete. The EHP review process involves the submission of a detailed project description along with any supporting documentation requested by FEMA to determine whether the proposed project has the potential to impact environmental resources or historic properties. The submission must show the project complies with all EHP requirements including applicable laws and regulations for the project to proceed. Department of Homeland Security and FEMA EHP policy can be found on the FEMA.gov EHP page (https://www.fema.gov/grants/guidance-tools/environmental-historic), including documents regarding EHP responsibilities and program requirements, implementation of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and other EHP regulations and Executive Orders.

All EOC and PDM infrastructure projects will be subject to the domestic preference requirements in the <u>Build America, Buy America Act (BABAA)</u>. On or after January 2, 2023, no awards or funding obligated for "<u>infrastructure</u>" projects will be provided "unless all of the iron, steel, manufactured products, and construction materials used in the project are produced in the United States." 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¹ Pub. L. No. 117-332 (2023) authorizes FEMA to provide assistance for certain acquisition and demolition project under the PDM Grant Program even if implementation has begun. In order to be eligible, the project must qualify for a categorical exclusion under NEPA and meet additional eligibly criteria as established by law. For more information, please refer to the PDM Grant Program NOFO.
