## FEMA Approves \$2,840,124 to New Hampshire Electric COOP for Electrical Transmission System Repairs

FEMA Approves \$ 2,840,124 to New Hampshire Electric Coop for Electrical Transmission System Repairs

REGION 1 – The New Hampshire Electric COOP will receive \$2,840,124 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for the costs incurred due to damage to the COOP's electrical transmission system as a result of an October 29-November 1, 2017, severe storm and flooding event. This funding was brought to fruition by a partnership between FEMA and New Hampshire Homeland Security and Emergency Management.

The \$2,840,124 grant represents the federal share of the total project cost of \$3.7 million. The remainder will come from non-federal sources.

This grant is funded through FEMA's Public Assistance Grant program which reimburses communities for actions taken in the immediate response and during recovery from a disaster. Eligible applicants include states, federally recognized tribal governments, U.S. territories, local governments, and certain private non-profit organizations. The grant applications are submitted from the state, which coordinates the process with local governments.



FEMA obligates funding for this project directly to the State. It is the State's responsibility to ensure that the eligible sub-recipient receives this award. Following the state's review process and upon receipt of appropriate documentation, they will provide funds to the sub-recipient on a reimbursable basis.

The New Hampshire Electric COOP is located in Grafton County; other counties to receive a Presidential declaration include Belknap, Carroll, Coos, and Sullivan. These counties received a Presidential declaration due to the extent of the damages caused by the severe storm and flooding on October 29 – November 1, 2017. To date FEMA has obligated more than \$7.2 million to the State of New Hampshire as a result of damages from that declaration, DR-4355-NH, under the Public Assistance program.
