Florida Residents Impacted by Hurricane Irma May Register for FEMA Assistance

ATLANTA – Survivors with losses due to Hurricane Irma in Charlotte, Collier, Hillsborough, Lee, Manatee, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Pinellas, and Sarasota Counties may now register for disaster assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency, according to state and federal officials.

Individuals can register online at <u>www.DisasterAssistance.gov</u> or through the FEMA App.

Applicants will need the following to apply:

- Social Security Number;
- Daytime telephone number;
- Current mailing address and address and zip code of the damaged property;
 and
- Private insurance information, if available.

By registering for federal assistance on www.DisasterAssistance.gov

- You can look up your address to find out if it is in a disaster area declared for Individual Assistance.
- Check the status of your application and get updates by SMS or email.
- Upload documents to support your application.

Another option for individuals, including those who use 711 relay or VRS, is to call **1-800-621-FEMA (3362)** while those who use TTY can call 1-800-462-7585. The toll-free telephone numbers will operate from **7 a.m. to 11 p.m. EDT** seven days a week until further notice.

When an applicant registers, each receives a unique registration number. The registration number is important and should be written down and kept handy. Anyone who does not have a registration number is not yet registered.
