FEMA may be able to help renters as well as homeowners with serious needs, displacement, temporary lodging, basic home repair costs, personal property loss or other disaster-caused needs.

The telephone line is open every day and help is available in most languages. If you use a relay service such as VRS, captioned telephone service or others, give FEMA your number for that service. U.S. Small Business Administration Disaster Loans

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), FEMA's federal partner in disaster recovery, may also be able to help. FEMA has streamlined the application process so people can apply to FEMA and SBA at the same time. SBA representatives will be available to provide one-on-one assistance to disaster loan applicants at Disaster Recovery Centers scheduled to open throughout the affected area.
