Disaster survivors should first assess their needs and speak to their insurance agents before registering for assistance. There are several ways to register:

- Go online to disasterassistance.gov or DisasterAssistance.gov/es (for Spanish).
- Use the [FEMA mobile app](#) in English or [Spanish](#).
- Call the disaster assistance helpline at 800-621-3362 or 800-462-7585 (TTY) anytime from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. local time seven days a week until further notice. Multilingual operators are available.

All recovery centers are accessible to people with disabilities. Centers have assistive technology to aid in communication. To schedule an American Sign Language interpreter, call or text 717- 395-1379.

The 12 Arkansas counties now designated for Individual Assistance are: Arkansas, Conway, Crawford, Desha, Faulkner, Jefferson, Logan, Perry, Pope, Pulaski, Sebastian and Yell.
