

Disaster Recovery Center Opens in Kanawha County

Charleston, W.Va.— A state-federal Disaster Recovery Center will open tomorrow May 28, 2024, at 8 a.m. at the Tyler Mountain Fire Department in Charleston to help West Virginia residents affected by the April 2-6 severe storms. Individuals in Boone, Cabell, Fayette, Kanawha, Lincoln, Marshall, Nicholas, Ohio, Putnam, Wayne and Wetzel counties can apply for assistance from FEMA.

Residents can get help with their disaster assistance applications, upload documents and get questions answered about federal disaster assistance.
