## **FEMA Assistance Available to Renters**

Renters in Baxter, Benton, Boone, Fulton, Greene, Madison, Marion and Randolph counties with losses from the severe storms of May 24-27 can apply for federal disaster assistance.

FEMA Individual Assistance is available to homeowners and renters, including students. Federal grants can help pay for temporary housing.

Renters may also qualify for a grant under FEMA's Other Needs Assistance program for some uninsured personal property losses and other disaster-related expenses. These may include:

- Replacement or repair of necessary personal property, such as clothing, textbooks, or school supplies. FEMA may also help replace furniture or appliances you purchased.
- Replacement or repair of tools and other job-related equipment required by the self-employed.
- Primary vehicles.
- Uninsured or out-of-pocket medical, dental, childcare, moving and storage expenses.

To apply for FEMA disaster assistance, call toll-free 800-621-3362, go online to <a href="DisasterAssistance.gov">DisasterAssistance.gov</a>, download the <a href="FEMA App">FEMA App</a> or visit a Disaster Recovery Center. The phone line is open daily from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. CT, and help is available in most languages. If you use a relay service such as VRS, captioned telephone service or others, give FEMA your number for that service. <a href="The The The Tempson and Tempson applications">The Tempson applications</a> is July 29, 2024.
