

Disaster Unemployment Assistance

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Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA) is a federal program that provides temporary unemployment benefits to eligible workers who have lost their jobs due to a disaster. DUA is available to workers in certain states who have lost their jobs due to a disaster declared by the President.

Eligible States (DUA) are:

Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming, and the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.
