

Help Remains for Faulkner County Residents after Disaster Center Closes

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. – After the FEMA Disaster Recovery Centers in Faulkner, Randolph and Washington Counties close Friday at 6 p.m., survivors of the 2017 severe storms, tornadoes, straight-line winds and flooding will still be able to get help with just a phone call.

In coordination with the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management, the Disaster Recovery Center in **Faulkner County** at the McGee Center, 3800 College Ave., **Conway**, will close **Friday, July 28**. Hours until then are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Many of the services available at recovery centers are available on the FEMA Helpline and the registration period for FEMA disaster assistance continues until Aug. 14.

Persons who are deaf, hard of hearing or have a speech disability and use a **TTY** may call **800-462-7585**. If you use **711** or VRS (Video Relay Service), call **800-621-3362**. The toll-free numbers are open daily from **7 a.m. to 10 p.m.**
