

Public Invited to Review and Comment on Revised Flood Maps for Portions of Travis County, Texas

Release Date: January 5, 2018

DENTON, Texas – Revised preliminary flood insurance rate maps are ready for review by residents and business owners in the cities of Cedar Park, Creedmoor, Mustang Ridge, Rollingwood, and the villages of Briarcliff, Point Venture, San Leanna and Volente.

The maps were developed by a team of local, state and federal government officials, and they will help residents decide whether they need to buy flood insurance. Additionally, the flood maps allow residents and community leaders to make informed decisions about future building and development.

The public has an opportunity to submit comments on the new rate maps until April 17, 2018.

Comments are objections to a base map feature change such as labels, incorrect roads or jurisdictional boundaries. The public can send comments and appeals to their local floodplain administrator, who will forward them to FEMA for final resolution.

The next step is the resolution of all the comments and appeals. When that is complete, FEMA will notify communities of the effective date of the final maps.
