

PrepTalk Released: ‘Let the Community Lead: Rethinking Command and Control Systems’

WASHINGTON — Today, FEMA and its emergency management partners released Aaron Titus’ PrepTalk “[Let the Community Lead: Rethinking Command and Control Systems](#).” In his PrepTalk, Titus challenges emergency managers to acknowledge the limitations of command and control systems and to rethink how we interact with the community.

Titus, the author of “How to Prepare for Everything,” is president of Mountain West VOAD, a group representing Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster in 12 states spanning from Alaska to the Dakotas.
