Puerto Rico Rebuilding

Public Assistance

\$33.9 Billion Total Obligated (Project Worksheets obligated - 11,109)

- \$720.7 million funding for Debris Removal
- \$4.7 billion funding for Emergency Protective Measures
- \$28.5 billion Permanent Work and Management Costs

Weekly Obligations

\$58 million/14 projects obligated (June 7-13, 2024)
