There are several Disaster Recovery Centers operating throughout the impacted area. To find a center close to you, go online to: <u>DRC Locator</u> or floridadisaster.org, or you can text DRC along with your Zip Code to 43362.

Currently, all centers are operating seven days a week, hours may vary. No appointment is necessary to get assistance.

It is not necessary to visit a center to apply. Survivors can go online to <u>disasterassistance.gov</u>, use the <u>FEMA mobile app</u> or call 800-621-3362. The line is open every day from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. ET. Help is available in most languages. If you use a relay service, such as video relay (VRS), captioned telephone or other service, give FEMA the number for that service.
