The agency has several openings for short-term, full-time jobs in Oklahoma City. The appointments are for 120 days, and may be extended based on the needs of the disaster.

Positions will fill needed roles in media, administration, community outreach and more, and range from entry-level to supervisors, with competitive salaries. Hiring locally is part of FEMA's commitment to the community. Additionally, it helps build America's disaster recovery workforce: many current FEMA employees started as local hires after disasters in their states.
