LIAISON OFFICER

RESOURCE CATEGORY	Incident Management
RESOURCE KIND	Personnel
OVERALL FUNCTION	The Liaison Officer is a conduit of information and assistance between incident personnel and organizations that are assisting or cooperating with the response.
COMPOSITION AND ORDERING SPECIFICATIONS	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This position can be ordered as a single resource or in conjunction with a National Incident Management System (NIMS) typed team (Incident Management Team) 2. Discuss logistics for deploying this position, such as working conditions, length of deployment, security, lodging, transportation and meals, prior to deployment 3. Requestor specifies any additional qualifications necessary, based on incident complexity and needs

Each type of resource builds on the qualifications of the type below it. For example, Type 1 qualifications include the qualifications in Type 2, plus an increase in capability. Type 1 is the highest qualification level.

DESCRIPTION	<p>The Liaison Officer:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Serves as the single point of contact (POC) for representatives of government departments and agencies—state, local, tribal and territorial (SLTT) and Federal—as well as for jurisdictions, Nongovernmental Organizations (NGO), private sector organizations, and other cooperating agencies and organizations 2. Speaks on behalf of the Incident Commander (IC) and Emergency Operations Center (EOC) leadership 3. Ensures that those who are not part of the command staff but who contribute to an incident’s prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and recovery receive appropriate information and exchange communications with the Incident Management Team (IMT) or EOC staff 	Not Specified
