PAPPG V5 Updates

- Equitable access and clarification for:
 - Houses of Worship (HOW) & Faith Based Orgs.
 - Private Non-Profits (PNP)
 - Tribal Nations

Focus Areas

- Maximize mitigation and resilience
- Reduce documentation requirements
- Increase focus on plain language
- Incorporate collaborative stakeholder input

Mitigation and Resilience Focus

- Clarified that mitigation measures can be implemented for all hazards, not just the hazard that caused the damage
- Added a section on nature-based solutions
- Incorporated PA's Federal Flood Risk Management Standard (FFRMS) policy and current Consensus-Based Codes, Specifications, and Standards (CBCSS) policy
- Defined resilience in the "Terms and Definitions" section.
- Added two new, pre-approved, mitigation measures to Appendix J that focus on buildings outside of the wildland-urban interface





Equity, Clarity, Accessibility

Equity

> Updated PAPPG, V5 to align with laws and Executive Orders (ex. EO12898: Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations)

Clarity

- Within the Recipient Administrative Requirements subsection, referenced the State-Led Public Assistance Guide and added language clarifying this process as "Recipient-Led," to be more inclusive of non-state partners
- Removed FEMA jargon, where appropriate.
- Clarified HOW, Faith-Based, and PNP eligibility

Accessibility

- For HOW, expanded options to support legal responsibilities
- Consolidated Private Non-Profit and EHP information for a one-stop shop approach for applicants

Public Assistance Accessibility for Tribal Nations

Accessibility for Tribal Nations

Clarified when Tribal roads are eligible for PA funding, specifically regarding those that intersect Bureau of India Affairs (BIA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) authorities.

Modified information FEMA requests from Tribal Nations to preserve the sanctity of sacred Tribal sites, respecting the Federal government's unique duty to support and ensure preservation of Tribal cultures, heritages, and traditions.

Provided Tribal-specific considerations within FEMA's scoping and costing methodology to promote the restoration of traditional tribal structures, consistent with PA's mission of supporting the overall resilience of Tribal nations and their PA-eligible facilities.

Clarified that federally recognized Indian Tribal Governments and state recognized tribes are eligible applicants.



Updates to Emergency Work Policy Areas

V5 updates to the Emergency Work Policy Areas

Emergency Work Updates

Hazardous Limbs, Trees, and Stumps

• Eliminated the need to take complex measurements to be eligible for debris removal

Private Property Debris Removal (PPDR)

• Removed the requirement for pre-approval for PPDR (applicable to both private residential and commercial properties

Saving Lives and Protecting Public Health and Safety

- Removed childcare services as a standalone EPM and is now only eligible when associated with emergency sheltering (both congregate and NCS).
- Removed pre-approval requirement before demolition work can begin (applicants must still be in compliance with eligibility requirements)



Emergency Work Updates

Snow Assistance

• Clarified that FEMA does not approve snow assistance for emergency declarations

Evacuation and Sheltering

• Expanded emergency sheltering eligibility for survivors' (owners) and their "household pets, service animals, assistance animals" related to emergency sheltering and distribution of supplies and commodities

Damage Caused During Performance of Emergency Work

• Revised language to allow the replacement of damaged trees, shrubs, or other ground cover as eligible if the replacement is part of the repair work when damaged during eligible emergency work activities



Updates to Permanent Work Policy Areas

V5 updates to the Permanent Work Policy Areas

Permanent Work Updates

Updated and added debris removal language based on policy memos, including:
Incorporated changes from the Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018 (DRRA), including but not to: Inundated & Submerged Roads (DRRA 1228), the new Category I - Building Code and Floodplain Management Administration and Enforcement (DRRA 1206), and Public Assistance 406 Codes and Standards (DRRA 1235(b)).

Hazard Mitigation

- Clarified that PA mitigation measures can be implemented for all hazards, not just the hazard that caused the damage.
- Added section addressing nature-based solutions.

Requirement to Obtain and Maintain Insurance

• Clarified when FEMA may modify the insurance requirement.



Permanent Work Updates

Repair vs. Replacement

• Clearly stated that the 50% Rule calculation may be re-run for an initial error by FEMA, but not for revised estimates.

Environmental and Historic Preservation

- Centralized all EHP information from PAPPG version 4, to explain the intent and "why" for all EHP requirements.
- Provided examples of project types that may have potential for impacts to natural and cultural resources.

Capped Projects

 Clarified that, when the applicant chooses not to repair the original site (e.g., an Alternate Project), FEMA may require that the applicant coordinate with regulatory agencies to determine if the proposed work will adversely affect any historic properties and/or natural resources.



Closeout and Cost Eligibility Updates

V5 updates to the Cost and Grants Policy Areas

Cost and Closeout Updates

Cost Eligibility

- Aligned reasonable cost with Simplified Procedures.
 - "A cost is reasonable if, in its nature and amount, it does not exceed that which would be incurred by a prudent person under the circumstances prevailing at the time the applicant makes the decision to incur the cost."
- Added clarification that an applicant may not claim fuel costs in addition to FEMA hourly equipment rates.

Final Cost and Closeout

- Clarified language regarding timelines and requirements.
- Adjusted and added language on NSPO appeals to clarify timelines and requirements.
- Updated Closeout timelines to reflect 2 C.F.R. § 200.344.

Appendix A: Environmental and Historic Preservation Compliance

- Provided clarification for the National Environmental Policy Act the National Historic Preservation Act.
- Included language for EO 12898, Environmental Justice.

Appendix D: Snow Declarations

• Clarified the sources used to determine snow fall measurement.

Appendix F: Work Eligibility Considerations by Type of Facility

- Updated languages relating to PA hazard mitigation to increase clarity and readability.
- Added Building Code and Floodplain Management Administration & Enforcement. Appendix J: Cost-Effective PA Hazard Mitigation Measures
 - Expanded Appendix J by adding two additional PA Hazard Mitigation opportunities at 100% funding.
