Survivors can visit any disaster recovery center. To find the closest center, call the FEMA helpline or visit <u>FEMA.gov/DRC</u>.

Recovery officials encourage Irma and Maria survivors who registered for disaster assistance with FEMA to stay in touch. If survivors change addresses or phone numbers they should contact FEMA to update their information. Missing or erroneous information could result in delays in receiving assistance.
