

Replacing Lost or Damaged Documents in West Virginia

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Those who may have lost or had damage to important documents during the February 15 – 18, 2025 winter flooding in Logan, McDowell, Mercer, Mingo, Raleigh, Wayne, and Wyoming counties may be able to replace them. STATE SERVICES

Birth and Death Certificates / Marriage and Divorce Documents:

The West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources — Vital Registration Office issues certified copies of West Virginia vital records. The fastest way to request a copy of a birth or death certificate or marriage or divorce documents is to order online at the [DHHR website](#).

Driver Licenses:

PREPARE AND PROTECT YOUR DOCUMENTS

- Make list of your important documents and accounts.
 - In the event of an emergency or disaster, you are still responsible for paying your bills, and having a record of your accounts and financial information can make that process easier.
 - Make a backup copy of your important contact information, including friends and family, health care professionals, service providers, insurance agents, landlord or mortgage representative, and more.
- Take and print pictures of your important documents. Electronic copies of your documents can be password-protected and saved to a personal cloud storage online. Storage is available for free with many email accounts.
- Keep your documents in a safe place. Purchase a lockable, waterproof, and fireproof file box to keep at home or rent a safe deposit box.
